The doctor and Clyde decided that it could be done in late August so Clyde could still have some use of that arm this summer and it was still in the right time framework to have the surgery. Janet is asking help from those coming this summer to make sure Clyde doesn't overdo it, and we are asking for prayers concerning healing, as well as provision for medical expenses since we do not have insurance.

A Late Addition...

After we thought this newsletter was finished, Janet and Nathaniel were riding the horses that Nathaniel just got from a friend and Janet fell off her horse. She was taken to the hospital with pain in her chest and hip, as well as no recollection of what happened. Janet ended up staying the night in the hospital with a concussion, short-term memory loss, a couple of broken ribs, and a very bruised hip. She came home the next morning with orders to rest and recover. Clyde and Janet are asking for prayers for her quick recovery as well.

Thank the Lord no one was seriously injured, but the van was wrecked. A number of people and churches said they would help replace it, but to this day no one has helped. We did find a new 2007 Chevy van with 4000 miles on it and, with the dealer's help, we purchased it for \$17,000. What a buy! We still needed help to pay for it. Stories like this are numerous in a faith home mission work, and sometimes the pressure gets almost unbearable. Then I have to sit back and thank the Lord anew and afresh for His goodness and that this is His ministry, not mine. I look over the hill and see another miracle building—the 40' x 96' firehouse/storage building that is up and under roof for a fraction of what it would normally cost to build, along with many other things that the Lord has done. Then we might get phone call, a card or a letter thanking us for the part of someone's life that the Lord allowed us to minister to. Friends, that's why we do what we do. Please pray for the Lord's direction and blessing as we move forward this summer.
